# **KRAKOW**

## **POLAND**

**13 – 21 May 2024**

### **Monday 13 May**

After assembling at our city centre 4-star hotel, located close to Krakow's endless restaurants, shops and markets and the cultural highlights of this fascinating city, an afternoon orientation walk is the perfect way to start the tour and by sunset everyone will feel at home.

The main focus of the walk will be the city's iconic main square which is one of the largest medieval town squares in Europe. It bustles non-stop with numerous cafes, restaurants, shops and loads of cultural heritage. The entire historic centre of Kraków, including the Main Square, is designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Dinner at one of the Polish restaurants around or nearby the square will be a wonderful introduction to the traditional Polish cuisine



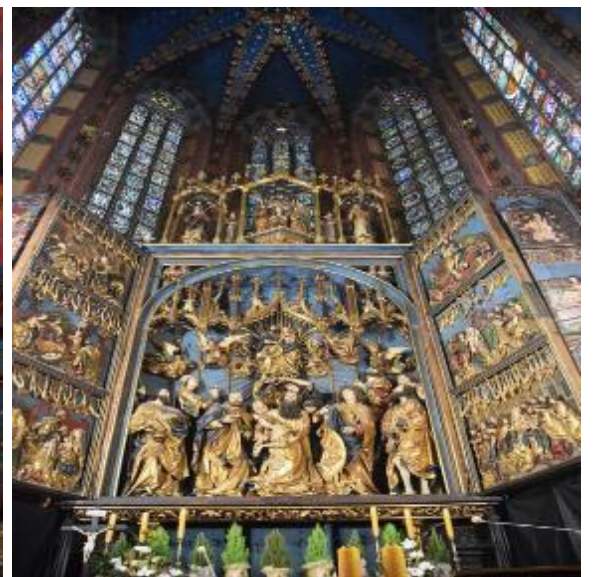
## Tuesday 14 May

After breakfast we head out for a half day guided tour of Krakow, with a number of major attractions to be visited.

Always a fascinating stop is the Schindler's Factory Museum, located in the former enamelware and ammunitions factory once owned by Oskar Schindler, where the museum tells the story of the factory's role during World War II, particularly in saving the lives of over 1,000 Jewish workers and the captivating story for a blockbuster Hollywood hit.

Other important stops on the tour will be the spectacular Wawel Castle and the amazingly beautiful Wawel Cathedral. The guide will then introduce the group to the local markets worth visiting as well as the best areas for shopping, art galleries, museums and restaurants.

Along the way, the guide will also explain the Culinary Delights of Krakow, including the beloved Polish dumplings known as pierogi, Bigos (hunter's stew) and the mouthwatering Zapiekanka. And of course the world-famous Polish cheesecake at Nowa Prowincja.



### Wednesday 15 May

Our first round of golf in Poland Golf this morning is at the Royal Krakow Golf Club, known as the crown jewel of golf in Poland, where golf is perfectly blended with nature between the Carpathian Mountains and Vistula River. A truly memorable golfing experience.



While the golfers are out on the course, the non-golfers will have the opportunity to explore more of Krakow and visit the attractions and places which they fancy, including the many sights pointed out by our city tour guide, the endless outdoor cafes, the stylish fashion, artisan crafts, and unique gifts to be found on the Square. A very special experience is the stylish Galeria Krakowska shopping center, which not only houses top brands but also offers a unique rooftop garden with breathtaking panoramic views of the city. Always a great way to enjoy lunch is on a day-time river cruise.



### Thursday 16 May

This morning we head to the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial. A sombre visit, but an important memorial to mankind's history. Their motto is: Explore the Past, Honor the Memory.

Our visit includes exhibits and memorials and the International Monument, and plays a vital role in preserving the memory of those who suffered. Each visitor serves as a tribute to the millions who suffered and perished.



Then an excursion of a totally different nature awaits the group...a visit to Wieliczka Salt Mine. A UNESCO World Heritage Site near Krakow where we discover the mesmerizing underground world of salt chambers, intricate sculptures, and breathtaking chapels carved entirely from salt. Over 45 million visitors have visited the giant underground chambers and exhibits all carved out of stone, and which lead to over 245 km of passages where salt has been mined. A unique experience and certainly a Krakow- must see.



**Friday 17 May**

This morning golf is at Krakow Valley Golf Club, known for its lush fairways, stunning landscape and impeccable service. Nestled in the heart of the picturesque Krakow Valley, the course offers breathtaking views over rolling hills, pristine lakes, and the Tatra Mountains.



This evening is one of the highlights of a visit to Krakow..... an Evening River Cruise on the Vistula River. As the sun sets, the Vistula River transforms into giant splashes of sunset colours as you watch the sky turn to Krakow's unique vibrant hues of orange and pink. And as darkness descends, the panoramic views of Krakow's illuminated skyline are truly unforgettable.



## Saturday 18 May

Today is a day at leisure with an endless list of activities and sights from which to choose.

The most popular are certain to be:

- **The Krakow Cathedral**, located within the Wawel Castle complex is a historic Roman Catholic cathedral built in the 11th century, and which has been the coronation site of Polish monarchs, the final resting place for many Polish kings and queens. The interior of the cathedral features beautiful frescoes, chapels, and a stunning altarpiece famous for its Sigismund's Chapel. The chapel houses the magnificent Sigismund Bell, one of the largest bells in Europe, weighing over 13 metric tons.



- **Wawel Castle** is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and dates back to the 14th century. It has served as the residence of Polish kings and queens and is a symbol of Poland's monarchy and national identity. The castle's hilltop location offers panoramic views of the Vistula River and the city of Kraków. The castle houses a vast collection of art, historical artifacts, and visitors can explore the beautifully decorated State Rooms
- Strolling through **Krakow's Old Town** with its markets and weekend food stalls



- Exploring the **museums** with their historical displays and antique artwork
- Relaxing in the **Hot thermal baths**
- An **optional round of golf** on one of the superb golf courses
- Lunch and a round of **indoor golf** at DWORSKA 4



**Sunday 19 May**

Today we return for a second round on the ROYAL KRAKOW Golf Club, to enjoy both the spectacular course and the opportunity to use the course knowledge gained on our first visit. It is a day to have your camera ready.



**Monday 20 May**

Today has been kept free to allow everyone to catch up and spend the day the way they want... ticking off their 'To Do's' not yet done, playing an optional round of golf at a nearby course, shopping for local bargains, enjoying spa treatments, strolling along the river, revisiting some of the local attractions or just simply "relaxing" Krakow style at some of its many sidewalk cafes and restaurants. There is so much to do in Krakow it is hard to fit it all in.





## Tuesday 21 May

After breakfast we check out of our hotel and transfer to Krakow Airport for our flights back home.
